Safety rules in the **Field Trip Guide** are posted at the society website. They should be reviewed, printed out and **taken to every field trip**. Also, insurance coverage for the field trips by the Federation is very limited. It provides only for damage that members might do on-site. There is no personal injury coverage; no coverage underground. Coverage is only for members, so our policy is that field trips are only for members. The lack of *full participation* of those able is discouraging to those of us who put forth so much effort to create an enjoyable time for the grade school students and the public. I realize that unforeseen last minute emergencies can occur to prevent your helping. But it is known a year in advance when the Show is scheduled and it seems to me that schedules could be arranged, annual leave requested, if you are truly in accord with the tenants of the Society.

Children's Day coordinator, Theresa Hubbard, did a fantastic job. She was able to have all 3rd grades in the Lansing school system attend along with other local schools. There were 1065 + kids in attendance during the morning, not including the accompanying 130 parents and teachers.
