FIELD TRIPS (continued) Three field trips were held this summer, to Sylvania, to Pugh Quarry, and to the Amherstburg Quarry. While attendance was low, those who went found them worthwhile. The Pugh and Amherstburg trips rewarded the trippers with some fine material. At Sylvania, the old part of the quarry, where so many of our members have found trilobites and other fossils, was flooded, and the new part was not open to collectors, so the finds were few and hard to get.
